Children were presented with a £5 voucher in celebration assembly. Reception won attendance of the month for January with 96.5% and Year 3 in February with 98.7%. Children were rewarded with a movie afternoon with treats and extra playtime.

School's overall attendance is currently 94.3%. We aim to achieve 96% by the end of the academic year. When we return to school after the Easter holidays (April 15th - May 24th) to May half term, if the attendance figures improve to 95% all children across school will be treated to a fun afternoon and served an ice-cream/ice-lolly.

This term the school council have been very busy. We have organised a range of activities and events all centred around the theme of **'Health and Well-Being'**.

Earlier this term for Safer Internet Day, we designed a quiz for children in Years 1-6 to raise awareness of the importance of internet safety and how to stay safe when using games and apps.
